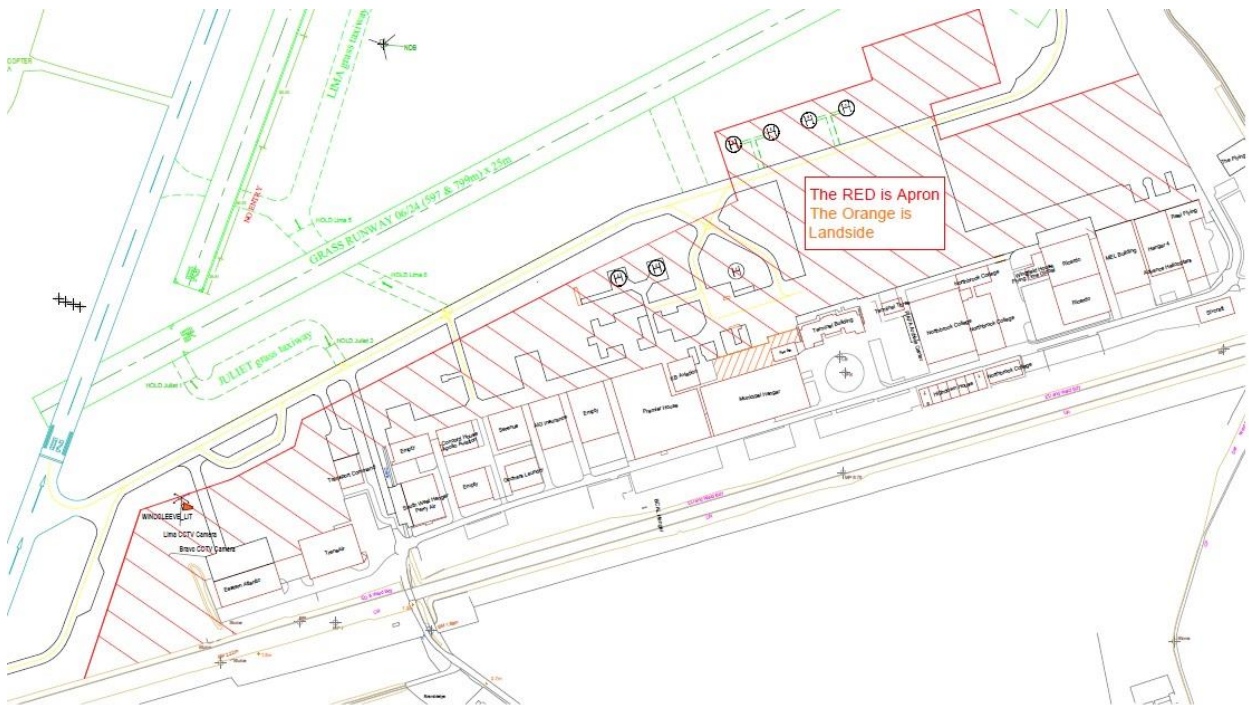
It is the responsibility of all employers to ensure that relevant Airport Notices are brought to the attention of their staff. However individuals remain responsible for their own actions and those who are in any doubt should consult their supervisor or manager.

INTRODUCTION

This notice is being issued to all operators and tenants, pilots and users of Brighton City Airport Ltd. This document confirms awareness of the restrictions and procedures for crossing the area between the Alpha and Kilo taxiway.

Following a review of the operational area the apron layout was changed allowing foot access to the helipads numbered 4, 5, 6 and 7 and the aircraft parking areas marked as the 70's parking rows. These locations area is now designed as APRON (see fig 1.) and are available for parking and passenger loading areas.

ACCESS & EGRESS RESTRICTIONS

Due to the logistical position of the helipads (4-7) and 70's parking area, only persons arriving or departing for flight are authorised to cross the link taxiway between taxiway end positions (the area providing access/egress between Alpha / Kilo taxiway) on foot.

- All crossings should be made from the centre of the apron under full view of the ATS Visual Control Room (VCR).
- Persons crossing must give way to aircraft and must stay a safe distance away from the taxiway whilst waiting. USE EXTREME CAUTION!
- Hi visibility clothing must be worn in this area.

Guests or other persons who are not boarding for flight are NOT AUTHORISED TO CROSS THE LINK TAXIWAY and are STRICTLY PROHIBITED. There are NO exceptions!

There will be NO maintenance to aircraft of any type whilst parked within the helipads or 70's parking rows.

APRON SAFETY

Operators and pilots are reminded they are responsible for, and must ensure they escort all passengers to and from aircraft at all times whilst airside. All persons providing escorting duties MUST ensure they wear Hi Visibility Clothing.

Operators / Pilots must not leave guests or other persons under their control unescorted at any time whilst airside. Procedures must be in place to escort all persons at all times without exception.
